



Vindication of the Rights of Men and Women

Mary Wollstonecraft

We continue our summer of revolution program with two impassioned works by Mary Wollstonecraft: *A Vindication of the Rights of Men* (written in response to Edmund Burke's *Reflections on the Revolution in France*) and *A Vindication of the Rights of Women*, in which she deals primarily with the inequality between men and women. With these works we can trace Wollstonecraft's early optimism and support of the French Revolution and the effects that rippled out from it across all of Europe, to her later suspicion and horror at the suffering incurred by many during this period. Wollstonecraft develops her thinking on many themes during the course of each essay, including the economics, politics, the role of the individual, the role of the government, and the ways in which they all interrelate.
